Dear National University Student,

Over the past few months, National University has enacted a number of changes due to COVID-19, including modified operations at our campuses, as well as the transition of classroom-based courses to online format. We made the decisions prioritizing the health, safety, and well-being of our students, faculty, and staff.

Considering the recent data and trends of the virus, **National University will continue remote** operations and the suspension of on-site instruction for most courses until July 2021, and until further notice.

We will continue to prioritize on-site instruction for various essential worker disciplines that cannot be taught online per the accreditor/licensure agency. Students in these courses will be notified separately with additional information regarding on-site instruction.

Per <u>H.R.8337</u>, veteran students will continue receiving benefits, including Monthly Housing Allowance, at the resident rate until December 21, 2021 or until the school resumes in-person courses, whichever occurs first. Veteran students must continue to meet all benefits eligibility criteria through December 21, 2021. We will continue to work with veteran and international students to explore additional solutions as needed.

Additional details and information about our reopening will be forthcoming as this situation evolves. In the meantime, we continue to monitor updates from national, state, and local health authorities, programmatic accreditors, state authorization entities, and licensure boards.
